The Office of Head Start requires recipients to establish and maintain a Health Services Advisory Committee (HSAC) to support children's healthy development. HSAC's are comprised of local health, dental and behavioral health providers, as well as Head Start parents, staff, volunteers, and community partners. Effective community partnerships are an essential key to maintaining and sustaining an effective HSAC. In this session, participants will review the foundations for building and maintaining an HSAC, discuss the importance of involving and engaging key stakeholders and community partners, identify and share best practices and strategies for sustainability and retention, and explore processes for continuous quality improvement.
